What are they?</p> <p>California clade; Holarctic Clade Both look similar, but are found to be genetically different after testing their DNA</p>	<p>What food source is known to increase nesting success (raising young) for ravens? Fast-food and other human garbage, or plant and invertebrates, or road-kill?</p> <p>Fast food, human garbage.</p>
<p>Do Ravens mate for life? Yes or NO.</p> <p>Yes</p>	<p>What materials make up a Ravens nest?</p> <p>Twigs, mud, lining from animal fur; roots from plants</p>
<p>How long is the incubation period for the Common Raven eggs?</p> <p>From 18 to 20 days is common</p>	<p>How long do the young, once they leave the nest, stay with the parents?</p> <p>Usually it is around 6 months</p>
